




Animal Welfare

Endorses responsible use of animals to satisfy certain human needs from food, clothing, medical research, even companionship.

Animal Welfare engages the practice of animal husbandry and ensures that all animals used by humans have their basic needs fulfilled such as food, water, shelter, and veterinary care while minimizing stress of the animal(s).



Animal Rights

An ideology based on emotion, not science or facts, while advocating...

- Animals are equal to humans.
- For the rejection of all animal use regardless of how humanely the animals are treated.
- For the liberation of all animals from human care from pets, to farm and ranch animals, etc.

- Weaken the economic structure of animal agribusiness.




Singer has argued that infants with disabilities do not have a right to life, and that parents should be able to kill a newborn if doing so "would improve the quality of life for the family."







California 2008 Proposition 2

"Farm Animal Cruelty Prevention Act"

Egg, Veal, and Pork Producers



California 2008 Proposition 2

Passed by 63%





Amendment A.B.1437 passed in June 2010

Mandating the sale of eggs imported into California must come from "enriched cage systems."

California 2018 Proposition 12

HSUS-driven

"California Farm Animal Confinement Initiative"

Cage-Free Mandate for eggs, veal, and pork



Proposition 12 went into effect January 1, 2022.

A lawsuit by the NPPC deemed that Prop. 12 was unenforceable as it requires the sale of meat sold in California to come from cage or confinement-free facilities across the U.S.



SCOTUS RULING Prop. 12

 On May 10, 2023, in a 5-4 ruling, the justices upheld a ruling to <u>dismiss</u> the NPPC's challenge to invalidate CA Proposition 12.



Trump Admin Steps In

 On July 9, 2025, U.S. Dept. of Justice is suing the State of California, Governor Newsom, and CA Attorney General concerning egg production and sales.

Ballot Summary:

"The purpose of this Act [would be] to prohibit the cruel and inhumane treatment of dogs in puppy mills by requiring large-scale dog breeding operations to provide each dog under their care with basic food and water, adequate shelter from the elements, necessary veterinary care, [space], and regular exercise."



Colorado P.A.U.S.E. ACT Measure 16 (2022)

- "Colorado Treatment of Animals Initiative"
- Protect Animals from Unnecessary Suffering and Exploitation.
- Coloradans for Animal Care, filed a motion with the Colorado Supreme Court about the initiative's ballot language being misleading and incomplete and that the initiative violates the state's singlesubject rule that requires initiatives to include one subject. Ruled 7-0 in our favor.

Oregon Initiative Petition 3

- The summary lead Oregon voters to believe they are supporting animal welfare.
- IP3 would charge livestock producers, veterinarians and even pet owners with felonies and misdemeanors for performing practices well within humane industry standards.
- IP3 would criminalize farming, hunting, fishing, food production, domestic animal breeding, livestock breeding.
- "Abused" or "assaulted" animals can be taken away with very little proof or investigation. In addition to immediate removal, owners would lose the right to own animals.

BETTER CARE FOR ANIMALS ACT H.R.3112 - S.1538

- A federal bill was introduced spring 2025, The Better Collaboration,
 Accountability, and Regulatory Enforcement (CARE) for Animals Act.
- With broad definitions, this measure could affect how animals are house and cared for on farms and ranches at the sole discretion of an inspector and their interpretation of the Act.
- This bill modifies enforcement provisions under USDA's Animal Welfare Act, including by allowing the Department of Justice (DOJ) to bring civil actions against violators of the act by removing animals, revoking licenses, issuing civil penalties.

RFID-EID Mandate for Cattle & Bison for "Disease Traceability"



RFID-EID Mandate Applies to:

- Sexually intact cattle & bison 18 mo or older.
- All dairy cattle.
- Cattle & bison of any age being used for events like rodeos, show, or exhibitions.

State Legislation

2024 ARIZONA SB1603 Tabled

 Would have allowed for unwarranted search and seizure of one's animals based on <u>hearsay!</u>



2024 Illinois SB3655

• A farm owner or operator shall not knowingly confine an egg-laying hen in an enclosure that is not considered "cage-free" housing system under the United Egg Producers animal husbandry guidelines for egg laying flocks.



Colorado Prop. 114 2020

- Colorado became the first U.S. state to "reintroduce" wolves through voter mandate.
- Went into effect December 2023.





Colorado Parks & Wildlife knowingly imported wolves from a pack with a history of livestock predation. What could possibly go wrong?

States prohibiting lethal removal of wolves for livestock protection:

- California, Colorado, Minnesota, and Michigan.
- Ranchers can legally shoot wolves that attack livestock in Idaho, Montana, and Wyoming.

Sonoma, California Local Ballot Initiative

- A "Yes" vote would deem confinement of animals "inhumane" and ban any confined feeding operation.
- This measure would put local farmers out of business, eliminating the option of locally sourced food.

Denver, CO Ballot Initiative

- If passed, would prohibit slaughtering of meat animals, ban meat processing facilities, inside the city limits by 2026.
- Eliminating 160 jobs.
- Promoted by animal rights group, "Pro Animal Future."




Agenda 2030
